

HOWTH CASTLE

The St Lawrence family came to Howth in 1177 and Howth Castle is one of the longest continuously-inhabited

private homes in Europe.

The estate includes much of the peninsula of Howth Head, including extensive heathland and much of the famous Howth Cliff Walks.

As well as a cookery school, the grounds near the castle comprise of golf, pitch and putt and foot-golf facilities.

URBAN BREWING


In-house brewery, bright terrace, striking architecture

beauty of the Irish capital's sensational seaside views around Dublin Bay; a recognised UNESCO Biosphere.


ZIPIT TIBRADDEN WOOD Found high-up in the Dublin mountains, why not have a
